***Kristin Finne, Project Lead, HHS emPOWER Initiative*** - The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) emPOWER program combines integrated de-identified Medicare data (so privacy is protected) with real-time NOAA weather tracking and GIS interactive mapping to highlight the number of individuals in specific area who use electrically dependent medical equipment in a geographic area strengthening situational awareness and provide improved data visualization for health professionals and emergency managers to rapidly identify the residential areas of people who rely on electrically powered durable medical equipment.

***David Bishop, National Temporary Emergency Power Project Manager USACE*** - The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) is often called upon by FEMA to assist in providing temporary emergency power at critical public facilities identified by state officials. Learn more about their Emergency Power Facility Assessment Tool (EPFAT); a secure web-based tool that can be used by critical public facility owners/operators, or emergency response agencies, to input, store, update and/or view temporary emergency power assessment data.

***Eric Cote, Project Director for Powered for Patients*** - An overview will be provided from Powered for Patients, a non-profit, public private partnership working with the American Society for Healthcare Engineering (ASHE) to develop a national dialogue among key stakeholders on the obligations of health care facilities regarding power maintenance, and their recent initiative with the Department of Homeland Security to launch a state-focused stakeholder engagement with the Rhode Island Emergency Management Agency.
